

8:30 am - Start of tour Meeting & Adjourn place: Raffles Hotel

First station – Singapore River. This river has a close relationship with Singapore. It is called “Enterprising Dragon King” in geomancy terms which the Singapore River is shaped like a dragon in the top view. This river plays a vital role in Singapore’s economy. There is an interesting legend behind this river; there is a prince in the 11th century spotted a strange beast (which he later learnt was a lion) upon his landing. He named the island Singapura which is a Sanskrit word for Lion (Singa) City (pura). The Merlion, with its fish-like body, is symbolic of the ancient city of Temasek (meaning “sea” in Javanese).

Second station – Boat Quay is the trading hub of Singapore City, where many corporate banks and finance offices are situated along this river. The Singapore River resembles like the shape of the dragon, in geomancy terms. The banks which are now standing is the dragons back, so it is called “Treasure on the Dragon’s back”.

Third station – Fullerton Hotel. The main hotel entrance is facing the Singapore River. The water feature design inside the grand hall resemblance like an emperor’s jade seal. In the olden times, the jade seal represents one’s personal power, status and wealth.

Fourth station - The building of **Victoria Theatre** looks like a “turtle” in geomancy terms. The Chinese regard the turtle as an auspicious animal for its longevity which believed can live a thousand years. During the olden times, geomancers use the marking cracks of turtle shell (representing the universe) as their tools for divination. In the mythical stories, the turtle is the court adviser in the dragon’s palace. Local people believe that turtle is a good nourishing food supplement.

Fifth station – The sun rises in the east and shines the old parliament building, which means the parliament is bright and powerful. On the left side, it receives the energy from the mountain while on the right side, it receives the water energy. Which the 2 good energy flows together inside the building. The bronze elephant standing facing directly the road, shields the bad luck.

Sixth station – The form of the **New Parliament Building** looks like the form of the wild goose flying in a V-shaped pattern. Wild goose from the north will migrate to the south when winter season approach. They are considered seasonal animals. They should fly in a V-shaped pattern so they can support each other. The wild goose has the character of being a good leader. Guess, the architect who built the new parliament building have done some research about fengshui and built it along the river and facing the sea.

Seventh station - Swiss hotel resemblance like the monkey God’s weapon from journey to the west. According to legend, the weapon actually belongs to dragon king. When dragon king lost his most treasured weapon, there is always uproar in the dragon palace, never have a peaceful day. It is believed that the weapon can touch the top most of the sky and can stand on the lowest of the earth. No wonder, there is always good business in the hotel.

Eight station – [Raffles hotel](#). In the olden days, it is a busy road where everybody going to the south must pass by. Distant rich merchants and high government officials rode wooden horse carriage and stayed in raffles hotel to rest. The architect who built the hotel have studied fengshui and built it accordingly.

Ninth station – Visit the place where it housed the Imperial Jade Seal. In the olden days, the seal represents authority, one's position and fortune.
